Mess Kit & Net Bag <i>Outdoor Education in Girl Scouting</i> Cooking stick (dowel) Notepad & pencil Pocket knife (no hunting knives or knives that do not fold) Age level handbooks and badge book Song books Resource books to use in Girl Scouts Own or Morning Watch Tape recorder for taping songs 1 large trash bag (for dirty clothes, ground-cloth, etc.) Sleeping bag in water-resistant bag or trash bag Extra blankets 2 complete changes of clothes layers and 6 pairs of socks Warm hat or hood Extra jacket or sweatshirt Ground-cloth for sleeping Personal toiletries Flashlight & bulb Batteries Bandana Special Needs: prescription medications, inhalers, etc. Small backpack or fanny pack Water jug/sipper bottle Sleepwear (sweat pants & sweatshirt) Bathing suit Sun hat/sunscreen Insect repellent Compass and whistle Work gloves Emergency money	Propane stove with extra propane canisters Matches (wooden) in a waterproof container Charcoal 20 - 30# depending on menu Metal roasting pans for holding charcoal Heavy duty or extra heavy duty foil Dutch oven Box oven Charcoal tin can stove Potholders or mitts Towels for drying pots Scouring pads Kitchen fly Firestarters (solid, no liquid charcoal starter) Clothesline for net bags Long-handled cooking utensils (including tongs, as appropriate to menus) Paper towels or wipes Can opener Coolers with ice for frozen or cold food Additional coolers or secure containers for storing dry foods Camp lantern for picnic table, extra mantles, bulbs, and batteries <i>Propane lanterns not to be used in tents, but are OK for tables outside.</i> Mixing bowls or large Zip-Lock bags for mixing Large Zip-Lock bags for leftover food storage Containers for shared beverages Cooking pots for one-pot meal and skillets plus container for heating water (dependent on menu) Dishwashing setup (3 pans, soap, bleach, dishrags, scrubber, spatula/scrapper) Toilet paper (1 roll per 3 campers) Small brown paper bags for feminine care products disposal 3 large outdoor trash bags 3 chimneys for starting charcoal 1 sprinkle can 1 rack for use with charcoal 4 sets of nested cans (various sizes) for raising and lowering grill/rack and for grease Paring knives and cutting board, spatula, measuring cups 1 hand-washing unit, include biodegradable soap 1 small basic first aid kit 1 tablecloth (old shower curtain is OK) Kaper charts Clothesline, rope for drying line Water purification tablets, if needed Tents, stakes, and guy ropes if needed Dustpan, brush, or sponge to clean tent Salt & pepper/spice kit Work gloves and hammer Coffee set-up Duct tape Hair ties Grace/song books
